concerts, teach master classes, and audition young musicians of whom eleven are selected for full scholarships to study that August at the Apple Hill Center. Five Israelis and six Arabs find that music can bridge cultural gaps where politics and diplomacy fail.

Beyond these Narrow Borders, 40 mins, Compassionate Listening Project

- The film follows the experiences of youth participating in the "Seedlings of Peace Summer Camp" in the Balkans. This project brings together youth from all sides of pre-war Yugoslavia to Latinovac, a small village in Croatia, to learn skills in the areas of Compassionate Listening, Nonviolent Communication, mediation, creative problem solving and cultural awareness. It has become clear that peace-building activities among youth in the region are critical to a lasting peace in the future. The existing situation of social divisions according to ethnicity after the war has left segregated youth with no joint activities and little or no contact.
